Key Highlights:



Report on NSS Special Camp, 2023-24 P. R. Thakur Govt. College

Introduction

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Special Camp for 2023-24 was organized by P. R. Thakur Government College from 18th March 2024 to 23rd March 2024 in the adopted village of Pancila. This week-long camp, designed to instill social responsibility and service among students, focused on community development, health awareness, and environmental conservation. Under the guidance of the Programme Officer Mr. Suman Sadhukhan and the Principal Dr. Swapan Sarkar, the camp was planned and executed with precision, ensuring impactful outcomes. The planning and organizational duties were spearheaded by Ms. Apala Chatterjee and Dr. Sucheta Mitra, who coordinated the diverse activities and resource allocation.

Objectives of the Camp

- 1. Engage NSS Volunteers in activities promoting community welfare.
- 2. Conduct surveys to identify and address the needs of the adopted village.
- 3. Organize awareness campaigns on pressing social and environmental issues.
- 4. Provide hands-on training in community assistance and healthcare safety.
- 5. Foster teamwork, leadership, and civic responsibility among the students.

Programme Schedule and Activities

Before the starting of Special Camp, a survey for special camp was conducted on 15th March, 2024. NSS Program Officer and Committee Members delivered valuable speech on how to conduct survey for Special Camp activities. NSS Volunteers learned how to gather questions for survey.

Day 1: 18th March 2024 (Monday)

Inauguration and Initial Activities

- The camp began with an inauguration ceremony, attended by faculty, NSS volunteers, and local villagers. The opening speech emphasized the importance of community service.
- Survey for Community Help: Led by Prof. Sanoli Patra, NSS Volunteers conducted door-to-door surveys in Pancila to understand local challenges related to hygiene, health, education, and infrastructure.

- Village Cleaning Drive: Volunteers cleaned public spaces in the village, including roads and community areas, promoting cleanliness and hygiene.
- Awareness Campaign on Cleanliness: A public session was held to educate villagers about the significance of sanitation and its role in preventing diseases.

Day 2: 19th March 2024 (Tuesday)

Environmental Sustainability Initiatives

- Awareness on Tree Preservation: Volunteers conducted interactive sessions with villagers, explaining the long-term benefits of trees for the environment and human health.

Day 3: 20th March 2024 (Wednesday)

Hospital Training for Community Assistance

- Safety and Security Training: Volunteers visited a nearby hospital and received training on safety measures required during community service activities. Topics included first-aid, emergency response, and handling vulnerable populations.
- Help Desk Setup: A help desk was established at the hospital where volunteers assisted patients and their families with inquiries and guidance, ensuring smooth access to healthcare services.

Day 4: 21st March 2024 (Thursday)

Focus on Food Safety

• Awareness Camp on Food Adulteration: A detailed session was conducted by Dr. Niloy Das to educate villagers about the risks of food adulteration and how to identify contaminated food.

- Village Campaign on Food Safety: NSS Volunteers carried the message of food safety to every household, distributing informational leaflets and answering queries.
- College Campus Cleaning: Volunteers extended their efforts to clean the college campus, setting an example of cleanliness and orderliness for others to follow.

Day 5: 22nd March 2024 (Friday)

Health Awareness Initiatives

- Dengue Awareness Camp: Dr. Utpal singha Roy led a session on the prevention and control of Dengue, focusing on eradicating mosquito breeding grounds and adopting preventive measures.
- Village Rally: Based on survey findings and awareness needs, NSS Volunteers organized a rally in Pancila to highlight health issues and promote preventive care. The rally witnessed active participation from local residents.

Day 6: 23rd March 2024 (Saturday)

Snake Awareness and Community Support

- Snake Awareness Camp: A special session by Dr. Pabitra Saha educated villagers about handling snake encounters, first-aid for snakebites, and avoiding high-risk behaviors.
- Community Goods Distribution: Essential items, including hygiene kits, basic medical supplies, and educational materials, were distributed to underprivileged families in Pancila. This initiative was led by the Programme Officer, with active participation from volunteers.

Impact and Outcomes

The NSS Special Camp achieved several milestones:

1. Health and Hygiene Improvement: Awareness programs on sanitation, food adulteration, and Dengue created lasting behavioral changes in the community.
